Talk for Writing:

Congratulations to all pupils for the enthusiasm and energy shown in their story telling. The children performed in the story telling competition to a very high standard. The school audience enjoyed hearing texts from 'The Dinosaur who pooped a planet' to a cumulative tale 'Nail Soup'. The children enjoyed varying their voices, adding different effects and actions. The Year 6 acted as the judges and provided feedback to each class including scoring them against the criteria. They planned and asked each class questions about their text in reference to grammar, punctuation and spelling. The children are gaining confidence talking about and identifying nouns, subordinating conjunctions and imperative verbs. Well done to Carne Class for being awarded the story telling champions.

Parent Forum Feedback

Thank you to the eight parents who attended our Parent Forum this week. It was lovely to see a few more parents and a lively debate was held; a summary of our discussions is to be found below:

Positive feedback - many of the parents said how pleased they were with their children and the work they are doing at school. They can see the progress they are making and thanked Miss Cameron and the staff for this.

Run a mile - the parents really liked this innovation which takes place during the mornings. Miss Cameron said that the run refreshed the children and their learning improved after the run had been completed.

Outside play improvements - Miss Cameron outlined the new play equipment improvement which will be built during May half term. This will include a climbing area and a wonderful early year's garden.

Wrap around care - Our new breakfast and after school clubs are now up and running. A discussion was held as to the low uptake by parents at present and the school is hoping to see this improve. The parents who use these clubs are pleased with the provision.

School Nursery - Our new nursery has been up and running for a few weeks and the children have settled very well into school life. Mr Lees confirmed that the school is considering how the nursery will work in September 2016.

Class and year group splits - parents asked how the year groups are split between classes each year. Miss Cameron explained that this is done carefully and where older children stay in a younger class this is always done after discussions with parents.

Drop off in the mornings - Miss Cameron outlined again why the decision was made to ask parents to drop the children at the gate each morning. This was for safety and to encourage independence.

Spelling, punctuation and grammar focus this week: Determiners.

Determiners are words that introduce a noun or noun phrase. E.g. a/an, the, every, this, those, one, some, many E.g. a cat, the cat, this cat, those cats, every cat, one cat, many cat. Challenge: Can you find any determiners in your reading book?

Importance of prayer and collective worship for Christians

We have been thinking about the importance of prayer to Christians. The children have discussed with their talk partners about its value and meaning to all of us. Each day we begin Collective Worship with a prayer when we think about coming together to reflect and deepen our relationship with Christ. They identified the different reasons for praying including: thanking God, reflecting on a situation, thinking of others, saying sorry and passing on wishes for others. The children have helped to make a special prayer/thought box for children, parents and staff to put any prayers or thoughts into. This will be in the main entrance so please pop any prayer/thought/wish into our box. These will be collected by Andrew Wade and included in his thoughts during his collective worship. During the school week of the 9th May we will be joining in with the Diocese of Truro's prayer week. We will particularly be thinking of praying for transformation across the World.
