Deliver it in class!</p>	<p><u>Geography</u> Can people survive in cold climates? Design a map showing where in the world these people live.</p>	<p><u>History</u> What was the <i>Ice-Age</i>? Do some research and perhaps draw and label some animals that lived during this period.</p>
<p><u>Design Technology</u> Design and make your own winter wonderland scene. What will you include in your design? You could use a shoe box to hold your design and then have it on display in class!</p>	<p><u>Computing</u> Research a cold country or animal and create a PowerPoint presentation about it. You could present it in class!</p>	<p><u>Art</u> Choose one aspect of the polar environments (or one polar animal) and create your own image of it – sketch/ draw/ collage.</p>	<p><u>Physical Education</u> Design a fitness regime for children your own age called ‘Winter Warmer’ – be prepared to share it in P.E.</p>
<p><u>Music</u> Create your own musical sound to represent the snow falling. Record it.</p>	<p><u>Religious Education</u> What do different religions believe about winter? Make a mind map of your findings.</p>	<p><u>Other</u> Have you got a better idea for a fun task? Do it! Bring your evidence into school.</p>
