LONGSHIPS CLASS

In LONGSHIPS CLASS we are about to journey to the past to visit the Vikings. During the Autumn Term, we will be exploring the Viking people and their exploration, settlement and trade. In order to begin this Viking quest, your challenge is to choose one (or more) of the tasks below to complete during the holidays. For evidence, you could bring in something as simple as a few photographs or a brief video, or you could be adventurous and create a model or a full folder of your work. High Expectations!

<u>HISTORY</u> What types of weapons did Vikings use and why were they so effective? Research this and show your findings in a fact file (or something different).	<u>ENGLISH</u> Imagine you are a Viking travelling from Scandinavia to Britain. Write a diary entry of your travels. Think about places you might visit and items you may collect along the way.	<u>RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</u> When the Vikings came to Britain, they had their own pagan religion. Find out which gods the Vikings worshiped and why? Share your research as a PowerPoint to the class.	<u>DESIGN TECHNOLOGY</u> Design and build a model of a Viking longship. Think about materials and the shape. Does it float? Bring it in to add to the class display.
<u>ART</u> Sketch a detailed picture of a Viking longship.	<u>MATHS</u> Create your own Viking-themed maths problems for the class to solve.	<u>MUSIC</u> Research instruments that date back to the Viking times. Present your findings to the class.	<u>ICT</u> Create a poster using persuasive vocabulary to encourage people of Britain to become a Viking.
<u>SCIENCE</u> Investigate how the Vikings navigated. Write a report to show your findings.	<u>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u> How would you stay fit enough to survive a life as a Viking? Create a fitness regime to teach to the whole class.	<u>LANGUAGE</u> Find out about Viking place names in England. Present your findings in a table.	<u>ANYTHING ELSE?</u> Have you got a better idea for a fun task? Do it! Bring your evidence into school.
