

Lesson	Sequence of Learning
1	<p><b>Week 1</b>-This week, your child will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Build a simple sentence using words they know</li> <li>•Write a speech bubble to show what a character is saying</li> <li>•Create a missing poster, using pictures and simple words</li> </ul> <p>These activities help children practice early writing skills, use their imagination, and talk about their ideas.</p>
2	<p><b>Week 2</b> –This week, your child will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Label a picture of an owl, using words they know</li> <li>•Write a simple sentence about feelings, talking about how characters feel</li> <li>•Write about being brave, sharing ideas through pictures and words</li> </ul> <p>These activities help children develop confidence in writing, build vocabulary, and talk about their emotions in a safe and supportive way.</p>
3	<p><b>Week 3</b> – This week, your child will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Write a list of things to take to space, using simple CVC words (like <i>cat, pen, bag</i>)</li> <li>•Design and label a Rocket-Car, using pictures and early writing</li> <li>•Draw and write a postcard from space, sharing their ideas and imagination</li> </ul> <p>These activities support early spelling, writing for a purpose, and creative thinking.</p>
4	<p><b>Week 4</b> –This week, your child will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Draw a story map, showing the beginning, middle, and end of a story</li> <li>•Design a star catcher, using pictures and creative ideas</li> <li>•Write simple instructions to explain how their star catcher works</li> </ul> <p>These activities help children organise their ideas, develop creativity, and practice early writing for a purpose.</p>
5	<p><b>Lesson 5</b> –In this lesson, your child will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Build a simple sentence, using words they know</li> <li>•Write captions to match pictures</li> </ul> <p>These activities help children practice early sentence writing and explain their ideas using pictures and words.</p>
	<p><b>Lesson 6</b> –In this lesson, your child will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Write about what it would be like on the moon, using their imagination</li> <li>•Use their phonic knowledge to write more than one sentence</li> </ul> <p>These activities help children build confidence in writing, use sounds to spell words, and share their ideas in sentences.</p>

### Sequence of Learning

**Week 1** –This week, your child will be learning to:

- Learn about the number 0
- Find and recognise numbers 0–5
- Subitise numbers 0–5 (quickly recognise how many without counting)
- Represent numbers 0–5 using objects, pictures, and marks

These activities help children build strong early number skills and confidence with counting and recognising numbers

**Week 2**-This week, your child will:

- Explore one more and one less using numbers and objects
- Learn about number composition (how numbers are made up of smaller numbers)
- Practice conceptual subitising (recognising small groups within a number without counting)

These activities support children's understanding of numbers and help them become confident early mathematicians.

**Week 3**-This week, your child will:

- Compare mass by exploring heavy and light objects
- Find a balance using balance scales
- Explore capacity using containers and liquids
- Compare capacity to see which holds more or less

These activities help children learn through hands-on play and develop early measuring skills in a fun, practical way.

**Week 4**-This week, your child will:

- Find numbers 6, 7, and 8
- Practise conceptual subitising (recognising groups of objects without counting)
- Represent numbers 6, 7, and 8 using objects, pictures, and marks

These activities help children become confident with larger numbers and understand how numbers can be shown in different ways.

**Week 5**-This week, your child will:

- Explore one more and one less with numbers 6, 7, and 8
- Learn about the composition of 6, 7, and 8 (how these numbers can be made from smaller numbers)
- Practise doubles up to 8 (like  $4 + 4$ )

These activities help children develop a deeper understanding of numbers and start seeing patterns in maths.

**Week 6**-This week, your child will:

- Explore length by measuring and comparing objects
- Compare length to see which objects are longer or shorter
- Explore height by looking at how tall things are
- Compare height to see which objects are taller or shorter

These activities help children develop early measuring skills and understand size through hands-on exploration.

## Sequence of Learning

### Week 1 – Dance

This week, your child will:

- Use flocking (moving together like a group) and different travelling steps
- Create a dance about a shoal of fish, using their imagination and movement

These activities help children develop coordination, creativity, and confidence in moving their bodies.

### Week 2 – Dance

This week, your child will:

- Develop and remember movement actions for a dance
- Practice putting movements together to perform their ideas confidently

These activities help children improve memory, coordination, and confidence while expressing themselves through movement.

### Week 3 – Dance

This week, your child will:

- Create a duet (dance with a partner)
- Use 5 different starfish shapes in their movements, exploring different ways to move their bodies

These activities help children work together, develop creativity, and explore body shapes through dance.

### Week 4 – Dance

This week, your child will:

- Perform a dance about creatures of the sea
- Link movements together in unison, moving together with their classmates

These activities help children build teamwork, coordination, and confidence while expressing ideas through movement.

### Week 5 – Dance

This week, your child will:

- Develop their skills in performing a dance
- Practice expression, timing, and movement, improving their confidence and control

These activities help children refine their coordination, creativity, and performance skills.

### Week 6 – Dance

This week, your child will:

- Practise and perform a dance inspired by animals from around the world
- Showcase the skills they have learned in movement, coordination, and expression

These activities help children build confidence, teamwork, and creativity while celebrating what they have learned through dance.

This week, your child will:

  - Learn to keep trying, even when something feels tricky
- These activities help children develop resilience, confidence, and a growth mindset.

### Week 2 – PSHE

This week, your child will:

- Talk about a time they didn't give up until they achieved their goal
  - Reflect on their own perseverance and celebrate their successes
- These activities help children build confidence, self-awareness, and a positive attitude toward challenges.

### Week 3 – PSHE

This week, your child will:

- Set a goal for themselves
  - Work towards achieving it, learning to plan and take small steps
- These activities help children develop motivation, perseverance, and a sense of achievement.

### Week 4 – PSHE

This week, your child will:

- Use kind words to encourage others
  - Learn how positive language can help friends and classmates feel supported
- These activities help children develop empathy, teamwork, and social confidence.

### Week 5 – PSHE

### Week 1 – Computing

This week, your child will:

- Learn how to log in to the system
- Move cars onto the road and add new cars in a virtual race

These activities help children become confident using computers and develop basic problem-solving skills.

### Week 2 – Computing

This week, your child will:

- Find the correct objects in a virtual toyshop
- Count how many toys they can see

These activities help children develop observation, counting skills, and basic problem-solving on the computer.

### Week 3 – Computing

This week, your child will:

- Match animals on a virtual farm
- Count how many animals they can see

These activities help children develop memory, observation, and counting skills while using the computer.

### Week 4 – Computing

This week, your child will:

- Match rockets in a virtual space activity
- Compare which rocket goes faster

These activities help children develop observation, comparison skills, and basic problem-solving on the computer.

### Week 5 – Computing

This week, your child will:

- Practice forming numbers using a virtual painting activity
- Recognise numbers up to 10

These activities help children develop number recognition, fine motor skills, and confidence with early maths on the computer.

### Week 6 – Computing

This week, your child will:

- Count using numbers up to 20
- Create a simple pictogram to represent data

These activities help children develop counting skills, understand basic data representation, and build confidence using the computer.

#### Sequence of Learning

##### Week 1 – Art/Creative Learning

This week, your child will:

- Explore mixing primary colours using their hands
  - Experiment by rubbing one colour on each hand to see what new colours they can create
- These activities help children develop creativity, fine motor skills, and an understanding of colour mixing.

##### Week 2 – Art/Creative Learning

This week, your child will:

- Use thin and thick brushes to make repeated brush strokes
  - Practice painting in one direction to create patterns
- These activities help children develop fine motor skills, control with tools, and an understanding of texture and pattern in art.

##### Week 3 – Art/Creative Learning

This week, your child will:

- Select and mix colours to paint a simple representation of a person, animal, or object
  - Explore how different colours can be combined to create new shades
- These activities help children develop creativity, colour mixing skills, and confidence in expressing ideas through painting.

##### Week 4 – Art/Creative Learning

This week, your child will:

- Use a thin brush to add details on top of dry paint, such as eyes on a face
  - Practice careful and precise brushwork
- These activities help children develop fine motor skills, attention to detail, and confidence in creating detailed artwork.

##### Week 5 – Art/Creative Learning

This week, your child will:

- Make lighter shades of primary colours by adding different amounts of white paint
  - Compare their colours to sample colour strips (like Dulux)
- These activities help children develop colour-mixing skills, understand shades and tints, and build confidence in experimenting with paint.

##### Week 6 – Art/Creative Learning

This week, your child will:

- Paint a picture of the planet Neptune using various shades of blue
  - Explore the style of Eric Carle, experimenting with texture and layering
- These activities help children develop creativity, colour blending skills, and confidence in expressing ideas through imaginative artwork.

#### Week 1 – Music

This week, your child will:

- Listen to the song “*Wind the Bobbin Up*”
- Respond to the music with actions and movements

These activities help children develop listening skills, rhythm, and coordination, while encouraging confidence in joining musical activities.

#### Week 2 – Music

This week, your child will:

- Learn to sing the song “*Rock a Bye Baby*”
- Practice using their voice to follow the melody and rhythm

These activities help children develop singing skills, memory, and confidence in performing music.

#### Week 3 – Music

This week, your child will:

- Learn and sing the song “*Five Little Monkeys*”
- Practice singing in order and joining in with repeated lines

These activities help children develop memory, rhythm, and confidence in singing with others.

#### Week 4 – Music

This week, your child will:

- Practice songs they have learned previously
- Learn the song “*Twinkle Twinkle Little Star*”

These activities help children develop memory, rhythm, and confidence in singing, as well as the ability to join in with familiar songs.

#### Week 5 – Music

This week, your child will:

- Practice songs and actions in preparation for a performance
- Focus on singing clearly, keeping rhythm, and performing confidently

These activities help children develop memory, coordination, confidence, and performance skills.

#### Week 6 – Music

This week, your child will:

- Perform songs they have learned to another class
- Demonstrate confidence, rhythm, and coordination in their performance

These activities help children develop confidence, listening skills, and enjoyment of sharing music with others.

## Sequence of Learning

### Week 1 – Understanding the World

This week, your child will:

- Find out what nocturnal animals are
- Learn about animals that are awake at night and sleep during the day

These activities help children develop observation skills, curiosity about the natural world, and understanding of animal behavior.

### Week 2 – Understanding the World

This week, your child will:

- Learn about the special features of owls
- Understand how these features help owls see and hunt in the dark

These activities help children develop observation skills, knowledge of animal adaptations, and an understanding of how animals survive in their environments.

### Week 3 – Understanding the World

This week, your child will:

- Learn about people who work at night, such as doctors, nurses, and firefighters
- Understand why some jobs are done during nighttime hours

These activities help children develop awareness of different roles in society, understanding of daily routines, and appreciation for the work of others.

### Week 4 – Understanding the World

This week, your child will:

- Learn that a shadow is created when an object blocks a source of light
- To understand that stars make patterns and these patterns are called constellations

These activities help children develop observation skills, understanding of light and dark, and curiosity about the natural world.

### Week 5 – Understanding the World

This week, your child will:

- Discuss and share ideas about why it is dark at night
- Explore the concept of day and night and the Earth's rotation

These activities help children develop critical thinking, understanding of the natural world, and curiosity about how the world works.

### Week 6 – Understanding the World

This week, your child will:

- Discuss what it might be like on the moon
- Describe what they can see and imagine about the lunar environment

These activities help children develop observation skills, imagination, and an understanding of space and planets.

Sequence of Lessons: RE

**Sequence of Learning – Being special: Where do we belong?**

**Lesson 1 – RE**

This week, your child will:

- Think about what makes them feel special
  - Explore why many Christians feel that they are special to God
- These activities help children develop self-awareness, empathy, and an understanding of Christian beliefs about being valued and loved.

**Lesson 2 – RE**

This week, your child will:

- Learn why many Christians believe that children are special to God
  - Explore stories and teachings from the Bible that show how God values children
- These activities help children develop understanding of Christian beliefs, respect for religious teachings, and a sense of their own value.

**Lesson 3 – RE**

This week, your child will:

- Think about where they feel they belong
  - Learn about different groups that some religious people belong to
- These activities help children develop a sense of identity, understanding of community, and respect for the beliefs and practices of others.

**Lesson 4 – RE**

This week, your child will:

- Explore ways we can show people they are welcome
  - Learn how babies are welcomed into the Christian family through ceremonies such as baptism
- These activities help children develop understanding of Christian traditions, empathy, and social awareness about inclusion and care.

**Lesson 5 – RE**

This week, your child will:

- Learn how some babies are welcomed in the Muslim tradition
  - Explore the ceremonies and practices that show care and belonging in Muslim families
- These activities help children develop understanding of different religious traditions, respect for diversity, and awareness of cultural practices.

**Lesson 6 – RE**

This week, your child will:

- Learn how Hindu brothers and sisters show love for each other during a festival
  - Explore the customs and celebrations that demonstrate care and family bonds
- These activities help children develop understanding of Hindu traditions, appreciation for family relationships, and respect for cultural diversity.
