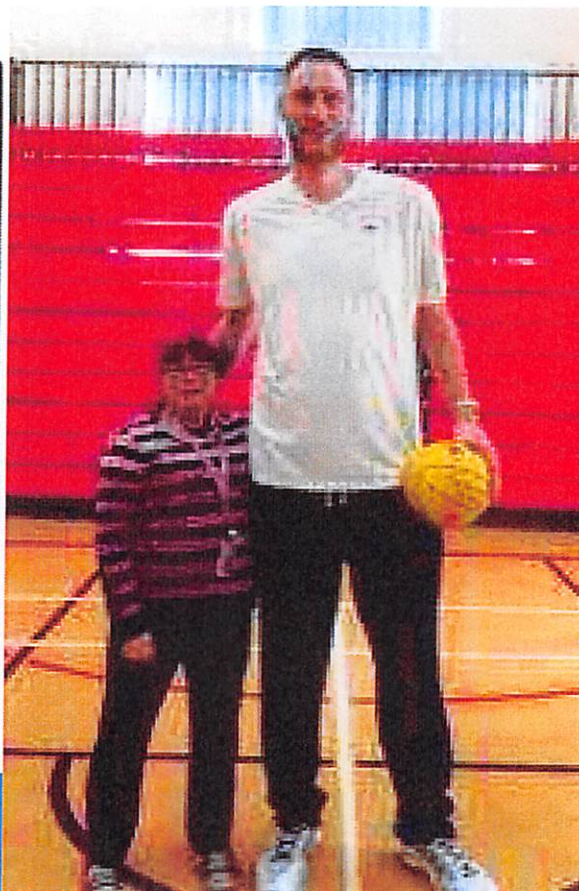

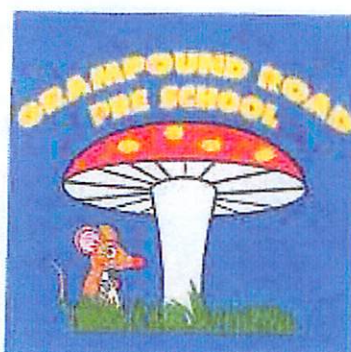

To raise money for Red Nose Day 2019, we will be doing the following:

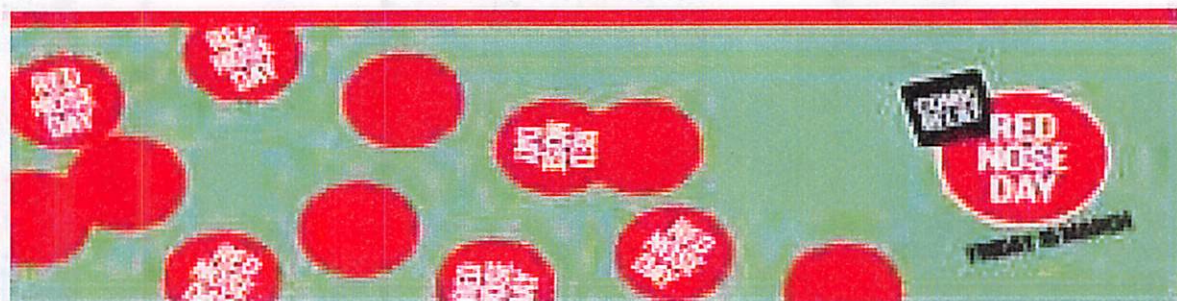
1. Come to school in non-school uniform.

Welcome back to school, after what we hope was, an enjoyable and relaxing half term holiday. It's great to see the children back with a renewed zest for their learning and today you should find a Curriculum Newsletter in the school bags to tell you about the learning opportunities this term. If you have a particular interest in any of the topics, we would love to hear how you can enrich our experiences, so please contact the class teacher.

It was only the first week back but already we have had some exciting and engaging activities:

On Tuesday 26th February Longships and Tater Du visited the Eden Project to take part in their 'Rainforest Uncovered' workshop. The children were challenged to become members of a research team to locate the Kombai Tribe and to unlock the secrets to their survival. After preparing their kit, the pupils journeyed into the rainforest to identify how the tribe use it for food, shelter, water and health. On return from their expedition, the children presented their findings to each other. It was a fantastic and enjoyable experience linking perfectly to our previous topic of adapting to an environment. Also it provided a brilliant introduction to our new Stone Age to Iron Age topic, where pupils found out how natural materials, such as plants and stone can help a tribe survive.

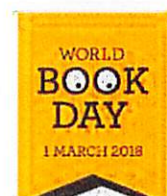
Head lice
