#### MESSAGE FROM MISS KENNEDY

As you know the on the 27th November, we will have a school inset day. This has been brought forward from the 1st of April. At Grampound Road the teachers will be using the time to determine the best way to spend their catch-up funding. In mainstream primary schools from reception to year 6 we will receive £80 per pupil. School leaders must be able to account for how the funding is being used in line with the goal of getting education back on track as quickly as possible. The grant will only be available for the 2020/2021 academic year and should be used to fund specific activities to support pupils catching up on lost teaching during lockdown. The funding will be spent on tuition, resources, and subscriptions. We have assessed the children's baseline levels and we are planning the support programme. It takes time to research learning programmes, for example Miss Hosking is trailing the programme Nessy, Nessy programs are designed to help students of all abilities learn to read, write, spell and type. Once our research is completed, we will complete our catch-up funding report. All the children will benefit, some will have additional tuition, some will benefit from additional resources or programmes. Although Schools knew the money was coming in September, we didn't know how the lockdown had affected children in the Summer. We knew it was important to ease the children back into school and it has taken time to assess their academic levels and to understand their emotional needs. We have noticed that some children have lower academic levels than before lockdown and many have found it difficult to focus for longer periods. This is understandable and an unfortunate casualty from lockdown. Our aim is that the funding will make a difference, this needs to be measurable. The children will be assessed at the end of the programme and this will give us the evidence to show that the catch-up funding has been well spent.

This week we have had a higher level of staff sickness than normal, but we have managed to cover all classes. I feel keeping all classes open is the best way we can support the children and families. Closing a bubble would be a last resort. If there was a positive case of the virus we would have to close a bubble, but so far so good. I can confirm that we are Covid clear and no one from our school community has tested positive for the virus.

Fundraising- Grampound Road typically participates in many fundraising events for the school and for charities over the course of a year. If we are hosting an event and if it involves for example children dressing up, we want all children to be involved. If parents can donate that is great, but not everyone can afford to donate and no one should feel that their child will be disadvantaged. All children can join in with all events regardless of donations which are anonymous. We love to see homemade costumes, the more imaginative the better!

Cheaper foreign production has seen all


Cornish production cease, however their legacy lives on.



### pendeen







### Trevose


