## Year reception-Homework Grid

In Gribbin Class we will be learning about 'People Who Help Us.'

Please choose one or more activities to do with your child. If you could bring the homework into school during the first week back after the Christmas break I can make a classroom display of the projects. Some of the activities are quick and simple, others are more time consuming, please just choose whichever fits into your family life. People who help us could be a career person, eg a vet or doctor or it could be a person like a grandad or other family member. The topic will last a half term and I want the children to understand how many people help them and their families in their everyday life.

Keep a diary of the people who help you during one day or several days.  You can do this using photos or pictures.	Complete a 'people who help us' question card.	Paint a detailed picture of a scene of someone helping others. You can ask an adult to add a sentence explaining why you chosen that scene.	Take some photos of your child acting out a story about a person helping others and turn it into a comic strip.
Make a model of a person that has helped you. You could do a model of a police person or a doctor or a farmer or you may have your own ideas.	Write a riddle about a person who helps you.	Interview family members who help you. You can draw a timeline of the things they do to help others. This may be a family member who has a career that helps others or a person who helps others at home.	Can you make a rhyme about a person who helps you.
Read 'Mog and the Vee Ee Tee.' Then draw a story map of the story.	Make a homemade costume to wear during the first day back when we all dress up as a person who helps others.	Make some story stones that tell a story about a person who helps you.	Can you make a poster about a person who helps you.
