






Trevose






ATTENDANCE

Pendeen: 94.8 % Trevose: 95.6 % Tater Du: 94 % Wolfrock: 95 %



Collecting children from After School Club


Now the nights are getting darker earlier can we please request that parents come to the main entrance to collect their children from After School Club.
