

Hello to all of the parents and, of course, fantastic children of our lovely school. These are certainly unique times that we are currently experiencing. Things we take for granted, like going to the supermarket, are now a completely different experience. Thankfully, the weather has been kind, and I hope you have been able to enjoy it in the garden or during exercise. I have tried to go for a few runs each week, although the hills never seem to get any easier! Certainly, what has been very inspirational during this period is the community spirit that I have witnessed. Neighbours having tea and cake (while socially distancing), the clapping for the NHS at 8pm every Thursday and a long stretch of road lined by people clapping a funeral procession highlights the dignity and respect we, as a nation, have.

One thing that Sophia (9 year old daughter) and I have done is make chocolate crispies. These are easy to make and taste scrummy!! Ingredients required:

100g chocolate (dark or milk, or we also used cocoa powder)

75g butter

4 tablespoons golden syrup

Smarties & mini eggs (if required, not necessary)

Bun cases

- Melt chocolate and butter, either in large saucepan or in large heat resistant bowl over pan of boiling water. **Either way, please ensure parents are assisting!**
- (If using Cocoa Powder, melt butter in saucepan and then stir in cocoa powder in stages until chocolatey for your taste!)
- Stir continually, while adding the golden syrup, smarties (if required).
- Add rice crispies in stages and stir until all chocolate mixture covers the crispies.

Spoon into bun cases, add mini eggs (if required), put on plate and into fridge to set.

Warning: they get eaten very quickly . Please take care and I look forward to seeing you all as soon as possible.
