## Assessment at St Piran's Cross MAT- life after levels

In September 2014 a new National Curriculum was introduced, bringing in some significant differences and completely changing the way children are assessed. Therefore, this year things will be different

Levels have gone. Your child will no longer be assessed as a level (for example 2a or 5c) as they do not exist. The curriculum for English and for Mathematics is now organised into year group steps and there is a clear expectation that children will 'meet' the requirements of each year

by the end of that academic year. We call this 'age related expectations' (ARE)

The new curriculum is also harder than the last one. For example, many of the knowledge, skills and understanding in Maths that would typically have been taught in Year 4 under the old curriculum are now expected to be taught and achieved in Year 3 or some even in Year 2.

There is no national method of assessing a child's achievement of the objectives for each year nor their progress within the new curriculum. Each school is able to determine their own assessment system. We are using Year group steps and subdividing this into a, b and c, b being that age related step.

At St Piran's Cross we are busy introducing the new curriculum and implementing a new assessment approach and this will have an effect on the information we give you.

During the spring term, via your child's annual report, we will send an update to parents indicating what Year your child is working within.
