Your task is to:

Research, plan, design and promote a new sculpture for the Woodland Walk at The Lost Gardens of Heligan.

You will need:

- paper
- pencils and pens
- a ruler or
- a tape measure
- the Heligan Map.

Sculpture is three-dimensional art made by either carving, modelling, casting or constructing.

This is a life size casting of a wren from iron. It stands 10cm tall. What do you notice about it?



This is a sculpture by British artist, Andy Goldsworthy. It is called Cone and is made from layers of slate. How big do you think it is? Why not research Andy Goldsworthy and make your own nature sculpture? Send us a photo!
