We had a brilliant start to our topic "Heroes and Villains" with an unexpected visit from Cruella De Vil! In ICT, we have begun to consider why computer simulations are important in today's world, and many children had seen one or could think how they help scientists, doctors, creators and designers.

Cricket was a little soggy but great fun, and we had an exhausting Go Noodle workout in PE.
