The year 6 children have completed the SATS tests and I would like to thank them all for their hard work and effort, they were awesome! The papers are sealed at the end of the tests and a courier collects each day. We do not mark or look at the papers so we do not know how the children have performed. The markers will mark the papers and the scores will be sent to school in July. The year 2's will start their tests next week, but these are quite different as and the children will be working in small groups with a teacher. Miss Eastham has explained this to the parents in the parent forum. Previously when we have undertaken the KS1 papers most children enjoyed small group work with adults and the adults enjoyed this too. Year 1's will have a phonic screen test and year 4's will have their times table check as well.

Up and coming events-Alongside the KS1 SATS next week, Tater Du class are swimming each morning and on Wednesday some children are joining other schools for cross country. Plans are underway for the Jubilee celebrations; we look forward to sharing an afternoon tea with the parents on Thursday 26th May. Mrs Prins has planned a school trip for Tater Du and Mr Salway is planning Wolf Rock's Summer play and the year 6 leavers service. It will be a very busy Summer here at Grampound Road, but I love it when we have plenty of things to look forward to especially after the last two years. That said, Fabulous Friday is a weekly event that enables the children and staff to focus on the wider curriculum, art, wild tribe, PE, music and Spanish, all this provision makes for a well-rounded education for our children.

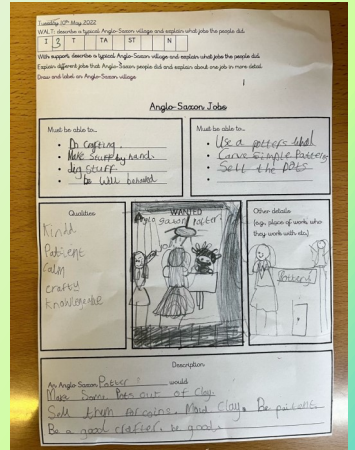
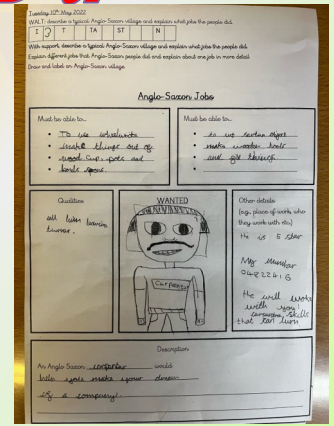

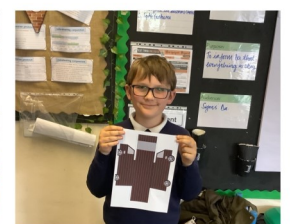
WOLF ROCK

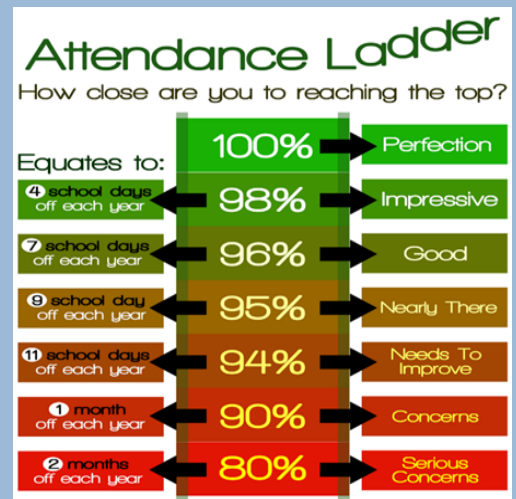
ATTENDANCE
