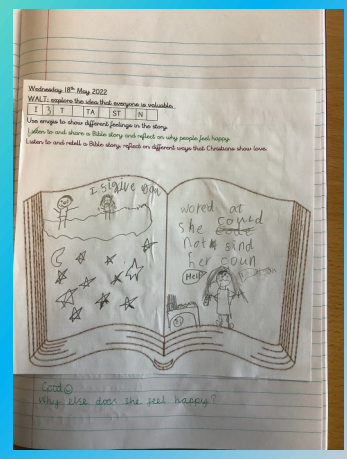
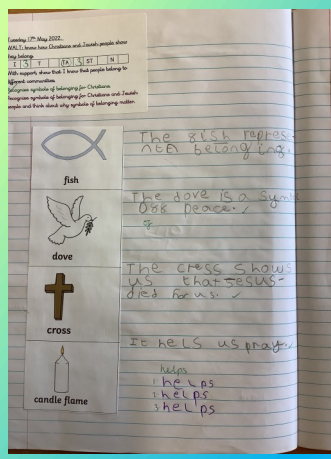
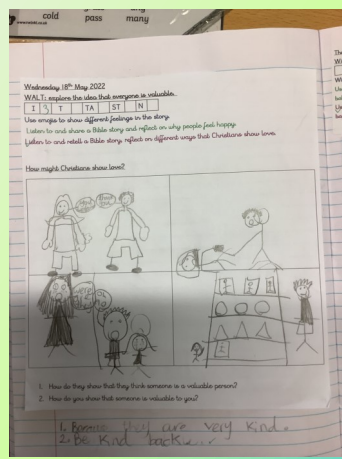
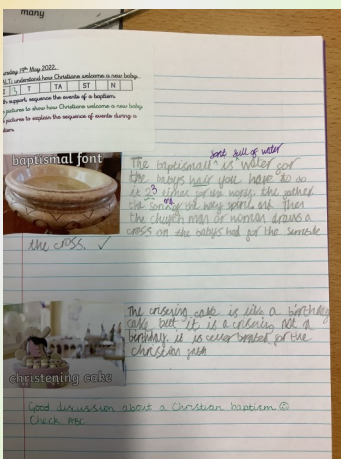
Trevose

What a busy week! A huge well done to the Year 2 children for all their hard work in their SATs this week, I am so proud of them all. We have one more reading paper to do next week.

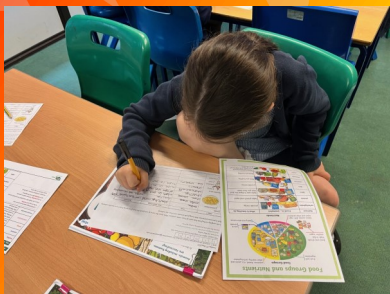

Hello Wild Tribers,

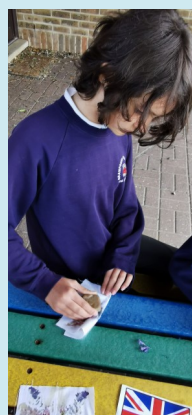
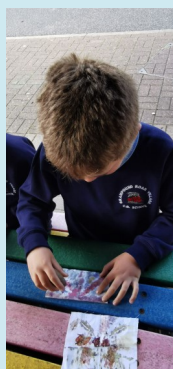
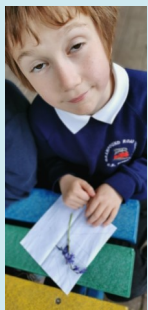
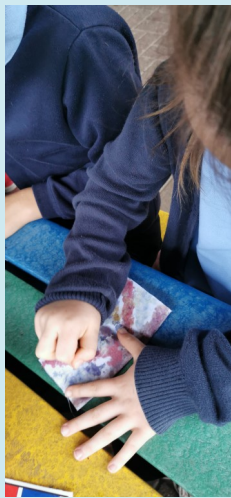

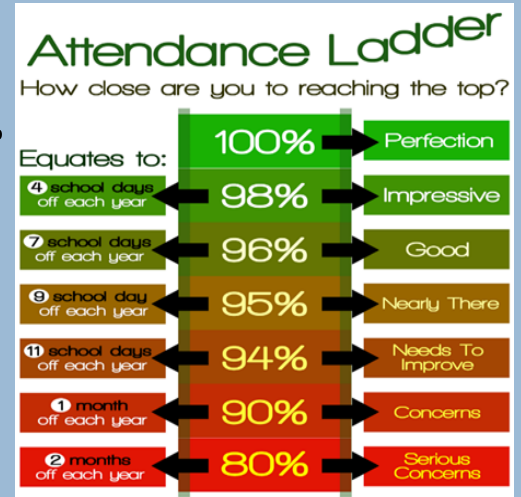
ATTENDANCE
