SATS-The year 6 children have been preparing for the SATS which begin on the 9th May. Miss Eastham will have a parent forum for year 2 parents next week to share some information in light of the recent technical Pre-Test of KS1 English Reading, which were taken this week.

Tater Du-Mrs Prins will continue teaching the children in Tater Du class, she is enjoying her role in school and is proven to be a great asset to our school.

School uniform - Please ensure the children have the correct school uniform and PE kits, this is why it matters: **1. Equality** One of the **significant importance of school uniforms** is to give a sense of equality. In today's world of fashion trends and brands, clothing has become a status symbol for children in schools. Uniforms negate that and instils a sense of oneness amongst them.

2. Focus on learning:

By wearing uniforms, students will no longer feel insecure about the way they look, their social status and will understanding the importance of school uniforms and having a common dress code enables a student to express and define himself be it in arts, sports, music, academics irrespective of the students' background and will no longer use fashion as a means of defining their creativity. Thus they will not have the pressure to conform to society in terms of their peers and will be able to put their energies on to learning and study.

3. Time-Saving:

It is common to see children having a wardrobe overflowing with clothes. As a result, they would spend inordinate amounts of time deciding the perfect outfit to wear to school that day. This consumes a lot of time. With uniforms, you would know exactly what to wear, you would not be obsessed with wearing the 'perfect' outfit, can avoid an argument with your parent over you getting late to school and will overall save a lot of time.

4. Discipline:

It is when you are a pupil that you learn the basic tenets of discipline and control that you take forward to your older age. Most importantly, it induces presentation skills, which help them talk with confidence and gives a sense of motivation and purpose

5. Promoting school spirit:

The significance and importance of uniforms in school is such that it generates a sense of belonging, pride and loyalty towards the school, encourages the attitude of working in a team that is reflected when they have to represent their school at inter-school events, clubs, sports and competitions.
