



## Remote Learning for Safer Internet Day Ages 7-11

This Safer Internet Day we want to support all settings and young people in exploring the theme, 'An internet we trust: exploring reliability in the online world.'

With many young people now learning remotely, this document provides an overview of some of the resources provided by the UK Safer Internet Centre and their partners that mean all young people can join in the celebrations, wherever they are.



## **Education Pack for Ages 7-11**

This pack includes an assembly, lesson plan and activity menu designed for delivery with 7-11 year olds. They come with slides to support with adaptation for remote learning. The pack also includes a document with social media and campaign activities. Educators are invited to pick and mix from the activities in the education pack and adapt for their learners.





Depending on your setting's approach, you may wish to consider the following suggestions:

I want to do a live video session with my learners



Use the Assembly Slides and Script to introduce Safer Internet Day and this year's theme. The assembly is easily adaptable and can be delivered by screensharing.

If learners can interact directly via video, try Two Truths and *a Lie* from the **Activity Menu**. This is a great game which can keep your learners connected when they can't meet in person, whilst allowing you to introduce some of the key messages around this year's theme.

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### An internet we <mark>trust</mark>

Exploring reliability in the online world



l want to make a recording and set follow-up activities Adapt the **Lesson Plan** and **Lesson Slides** for remote learning by focussing on *Activity 1, 2 and 3*. Before they watch your recording, you could get learners to note down what they think an advert is and all the different places they might've seen them.

Then share the video on *Slide 7* and pre-record teaching input using *Slides 8-19* (a screensharing video would work best). Afterwards, give learners a copy of *Slides 20-23* to complete independently by printing, or online with textboxes/annotations.

I want to set learners an activity they can do on their own

Share the scenarios for *Feelings* from the **Activity Menu**. Ask learners to pick one and imagine they're a friend of this person. Ask them to write a response giving their friend some advice – this could be in an email format.

Try *Have Your Say* in the **Activity Menu**. This activity involves sharing key questions on the theme of trust online and could be done in a shared document or using other collaborative online spaces like Padlet or Mentimeter. Ask learners to answer the questions and, if possible, respond to each other's answers.

I need to print content for learners with limited internet access

Share the black and white copy of the social media template from the **Campaign and Social Media Activities** document. Learners can decorate and colour the page, and fill the magnifying glass symbol with words, illustrations or a pledge linked to this year's theme.
