PE Premium Report – Grampound Road

Report for the Period 1st September 2015- 31st August 2016



This funding was received between the dates stated above during the grant period 2015/2016 and 2016/2017.

Purpose of the grant

This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2015 to 2016 academic year so that they develop healthy lifestyles.

Basis of allocation

Allocations for the academic year 2015/16 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Year R, as recorded on January 2015 Census (referred to as “eligible pupils” below), as follows:

- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil.

Roseland	£3600	Extensive CPD opportunities for subject leader and all staff members – class teachers and TA's. Staff feeling more confident delivering PE and feel well supported by coach. They have developed knowledge of Dodgeball, hockey and gym skills. Sporting challenges set by Roseland and sports expert Andy Ayres which encourage children to take part in competitive sports challenges on a regular basis.
