We cannot do this alone; we need the support of parents/carers to be successful. I would say the most important area that you can support your child is in reading. The more practise a child has in reading, the more progress they will make. The benefits of reading are well documented, and they include:

Pupils vocabulary is larger and more extensive.

Children perform better academically.

Their imagination can run wild.

Their creativity skills develop.

They develop empathy.

They gain a deeper understanding of their world.

Their concentration levels improve.

The parent and child bond improves.

Their cognitive development is supported.

Their social skills and interaction improve.

In Science, we have been exploring the structure of wildflowers and looking closely at the different parts before labelling them.












Tater Du




To complement our learning in Science,
