Assessments-Next week we will be assessing the children in school. Assessment is carried out to see what children know, understand and are able to do. Assessment is very important for tracking progress, planning and identifying the next steps in learning and to monitor progress. The teachers will use the information to help parents to understand how they can support their child with learning at home. The assessments will be in reading, maths and writing. In key stage 1 it will look very different to key stage 2. In key stage 1 Miss Eastham will work with small groups, so the children will probably think it is a normal lesson, as they do tend to work in groups anyway. Assessments are completed every term, that is only three assessment points in a year.

Climbing the trees and monument-Polite request, please do not let your children climb the monument or the trees at pick up or drop off. The tree was damaged last week, and we want to avoid it happening again. The monument is quite high, and we do not want to see children climbing that either as they are at risk of an injury.

Songs-In school we are learning some songs during our collective worship, the songs are 'this little light of mine' and 'morning has broken', please feel free to practice at home, singing does release some of those all-important happy hormones which can raise spirits during these long winter evenings.

Nativity-The teachers have prepared the scripts and the children will soon be given their roles. It will be a musical nativity so every child in the EYFS and Trevose class will have singing roles. There are quite a few songs to learn! The nativity is a special performance and I have no doubt that the staff and children will put their heart and soul into practising and rehearsing. All being well we would like to perform to a live audience this year, with a few Covid rules in place to protect everyone.

Thank you to the friends of Grampound Road, your enthusiasm and dedication to the school is highly commendable.

This week we have been learning about different vocabulary that we use in our writing. We have been using powerful verbs and adventurous adjectives in our own writing about Jack and the beanstalk. We have also been exploring the different properties of materials and have learnt how materials' properties that make them useful for different things. We have then been using this scientific vocabulary in our own descriptions of different materials.

In computing this week, we have developed our understanding of what the internet is, and we have explored what a 'search engine' is and how to use one. We were fascinated to see how quickly Google found us information about dinosaurs!

We have been talking about our topic a lot this week and we are all really looking forward to our trip on Monday to Pendennis castle!







We have been continuing to practise our addition and subtraction methods with some dice games and we are beginning to get much more familiar with bar models by attempting the White Rose Maths Barvember challenges each day. We have been learning how to use accurate punctuation in direct speech and thinking of different words to use other than "said". In Science, we learnt how to make series circuits and integrated a switch into them. I have been really impressed with everyone's use of correct terminology in Grammar and scientific words this week - well done everyone!

We have been learning how to be super at striking the ball in cricket with Mr Sheik, and we also linked together balances and jumps in gymnastics. We have also been focussing upon improving our listening and organisation skills this week. I wonder whether you can practise these at home.

On a personal note, thank you so much to Mrs Mills for all her brilliant work in Tater Du class during the past two terms. You have had a massive positive influence on everyone's learning and been an amazing support to all the staff in the room. You will have an awesome time working with the Wolf Rockers and we will look forward to seeing you every Friday.
