I hope everyone had a lovely half term and enjoying the sunshine.



Expected average attendance for a child is 96.1%. Our attendance figures for last week were as follows:


Pendeen: 90.4% Trevose: 99.5 % Tater Du: 92 % Wolfrock:89.5 %




