## Parent Forum Feedback

Thank you to the 8 parents and two wonderful young children who attended our last Parent Forum of this year. This was a great improvement on the attendance front and Mr Lees tells me it is the best within our trust of schools so far this term!

- Staff changes Some parents have been concerned about the recent changes of staff, however they are aware that this is beyond the schools abilities to control. Miss Cameron reassured parents that our new teachers from September 2016 will be employed for the year and will be excellent additions to the staff team, she also confirmed that when staff are absent she endeavours to find cover teachers of the highest quality. Mr Lees noted that the recruitment of teachers in all schools has been a challenge this year.
- Spilt classes a parent enquired as to why we will have a Year 5 and 6 class in September 2016.

  Miss Cameron explained that the next Year 6 are simply too small to be in one class on their own.
- Nursery provision from September 2016 parents wondered whether the nursery provision will continue in the new school year. Miss Cameron confirmed that it is our aim to provide this again after the new reception children have settled into their class and the life of the school.
- INSET Days a parent asked whether it had been agreed to put the days together into one week. Mr Lees confirmed that this had been agreed and parents had been notified in the St Piran's Post in April 2016 of this. A long discussion took place about this decision and it was agreed that it would help all parents who want to attend the Royal Cornwall Show in 2017 with their families. Mr Lees said that no other holidays would be authorised during the school term during 2016/17. He stated that it was the school and trust duty to insist upon full attendance at school unless children were ill.
- Run a mile one parents said that her child found this activity very tiring. The general consensus was that the children are benefiting from this burst of energy during the morning and it would continue. They are clearly learning better after doing it.

#### Booking Places at Breakfast and After School Club

Our before and after school childcare provision is becoming increasingly popular. Can we remind parents that if you book a place for your child we expect to be notified if you have to cancel this.

Places cancelled with 24 hours-notice will not be charged, any cancellation with less than 24 hour- notice will be charged at the full rate unless there is exceptional circumstances or a family emergency. We deploy and pay our staff on the number of bookings we receive for each slot.
