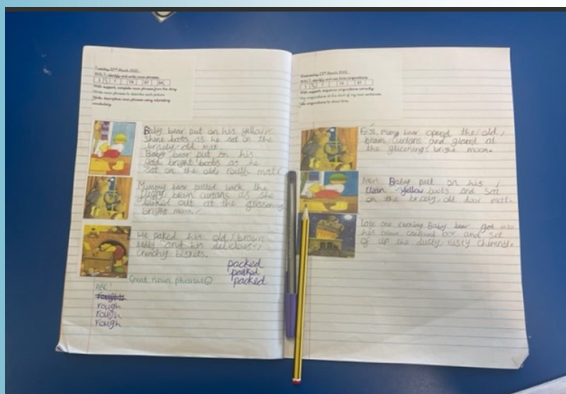

What a glorious day we've had, sun was shining in the sky, there wasn't a cloud in sight.

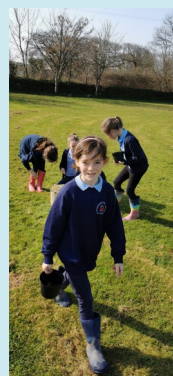
Tater Du and Wolf Rock were discovering the ancient Japanese printing art called Hapa Zome.

We were looking around to find a fantastic colours from the Mather Nature to produce some impressive, symmetrical patterns.

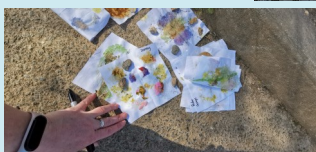
Inspired and hungry wild tribes had a marvellous time by the fire baking potatoes and roasting marshmallows.

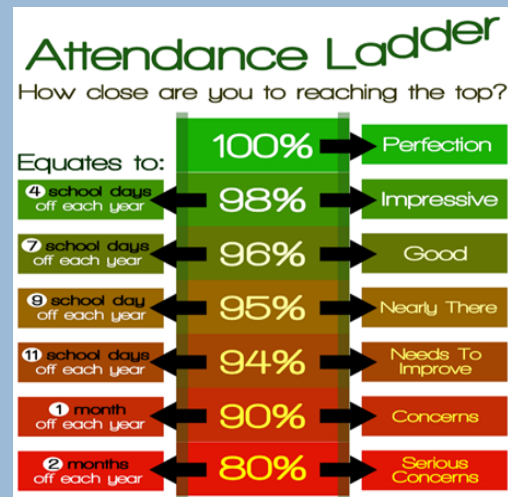
ATTENDANCE
