- Tuesday Proper Nouns (specific nouns that begin with a capital letter e.g. Bob, Mars,
 Truro, Friday).
- Wednesday Adjectives (describing words e.g. red, gigantic, putrid).
- Thursday Verbs (action or states of being e.g. shouting, swam, have, squirmed).
- Friday Adverbs (describe how an action is performed e.g. slowly, cautiously, gently).
